Welcome to BJC2001 Cardiff

The organising committee would like to welcome you all personally to BJC 2001 and to Cardiff, but we're busy so this will have to do, we hope you enjoy the convention we have organised for you. We have packed as much fun and frivolity as possible into the convention. There is a full programme of shows, cabarets, bands and DJs for your on-site entertainment plus opportunities to watch and take part in some excellent off-site entertainments. The on-site Bar is open from 2 pm to 1 am everyday and we have a variety of catering available for you from 8 am until late. One hall is open 24 hours a day and the others are open 8 am to midnight. We want everyone to enjoy the convention and to this end there follows some safety information and rules for the site. Please read and follow them so we can all enjoy a relaxed and hassle free convention.

Please note:

There is No Smoking in the school buildings.
There are No Fires allowed on the outside site.
There are No Animals allowed on site. (except far guide dogs)
There will be no access to any convention facilities without the convention pass.

First Aid for the indoor site is situated at the Registration Office. If you/or a friend need emergency treatment contact the nearest steward with a radio and get them to call control stating your location. If it's less serious make your own way to Registration.

Lost Children will be looked after at Registration so if you notice that your family has got smaller please report to registration.

Refuse please respect the site and use the bins for litter. Black bags for campers are available at registration. When you've filled a bag put them in the skip on the outdoor site.

Toilets there are many toilets in the school and we have provided 2 unisex toilets and a disabled toilet on the outside site. If you can make it to a toilet in the school (esp. for no 2's!) please do. Just cos there's no Glastonbury doesn't mean we're going miss the stinking bogs.

Workshops and Tricks Well it's a circus convention and by description that makes it death defying and dangerous so please, please be sensible when working with new equipment or trying new tricks. Make sure that you use spotters for acrobatics and trapeze and make use of the workshops where proper supervision is available.

Respect for neighbours The school site is very residential, so please keep the noise down in the car parks and vehicle park-up especially late at night. The outdoor site is faraway from housing so here's the place to make noise.

Mud We know it happens! But this year we will be very strict about keeping mud on the outside site. Please change shoes before going into the halls and never use shoes on the mats. If you don't have a spare pair of shoes take your outdoor ones off.

Buses On Saturday, buses for the off-site events will leave at 12 noon from the assembly point on Lawrenny Avenue, there will NOT be later buses from the convention site for the public show. If you do not catch the buses at 12 noon you will have to make your own way to the Games and Public Shows.

The assembly point is outside the school on Lawrenny Avenue (between School and outdoor site).
