Where is registration?

It is the tent at the entrance to the compound where you were given this. Lost property, lost children, first aid, information, etc are all at registration.

All that important stuff that you

Emergency

If there is a really big emergency please go directly to the fire assembly point (see site map). Leave the area your are in as quickly and calmly as possible and do not stop to collect your belongings. Ensure that you know where the emergency assembly point is now by checking the map - go on then do it.

First Aid

Our security guards are trained first aiders, come to the registration for assistance. If you need attention when registration is closed ask the security at the entrance. Accident and Emergency is at the Derby Royal Infirmary, 15 mins away by car, if in any doubt please ask. First aid kits at registration and NFS tent.

Drinking water

The water from stand pipes in the camping area comes from a natural spring, we recommend that you boil it before drinking.

Some site rules - just a few but please respect them

As Broomfield is a working agricultural college with an organic policy:

DO NOT tip your waste water into the ditches or onto the field, please dispose of it in the waste water butts provided by the water stands.

USE THE TOILETS not the hedges.

NO OPEN FIRES, but barbeques are fine.

STRICTLY NO ANIMALS to be brought onto site.

KEEP to the paths around the site, even if a field looks empty there could be something growing, keep away from any farm machinery and respect the organic gardens. Parents be aware of the dangers if you let your kids wander around on their own.

Fire precautions

If you plan to play with fire, please be careful. If it's your first time, then it's a really good idea to try it in the daylight first to get the feel of your new torches, staff, chains or whatever. There is a dedicated fire area, please stick to it and don't go setting fire to your neighbour's tent. Be sensible - check you have enough space around you, don't leave open containers of paraffin lying around, never ever use petrol and make sure you know where first aid is just in case. Firebreathing is really not recommended, but if you must then please make absolutely sure that you know what you are doing.

Camping

Please camp within the designated spaces, keeping the fire lanes clear and respect the quiet camping area.

Drugs Just to remind you - drugs are as illegal on the convention site as off site.

Toilets and showers

All around the site - look at your map.

The showers in the accommodation blocks will only be open 11am - 8pm. The student union showers are 24hr access and are located behind the building. The showers in Broomfield Hall will be open 8am - 10pm.

Telephone There is a pay phone near to the canteen, see map.

Cash machine In the student union building, otherwise its a trip to Morrisons.

Laundry room There are coin op washing machines and driers here - see map.

Massage

Student union shop

Strangely enough located in the student union - if you have forgotten your toothbrush, deodorant, pot noodles or want to buy basic foodstuffs, or... well just wander along and see what they've got. Opening hours are 10am - 3pm.

Accommodation


Please vacate your room and return the key by 11am on Sunday.


Rubbish

Beer

The student union will be serving during the day:

Thursday 11am - 6pm, Friday 11am - 6pm, Saturday 11am - 2pm. There are drinks machines, pool table, sofas and videos during the day in here if you need a rest from juggling.

The beer tent will be serving in the evenings:

Wednesday 7pm - 11pm, Thursday 6pm - 1am, Friday 6pm - 1:30am, Saturday 10pm -1.30am

There are two pubs near the site, turn left at end of the driveway, walk for one mile for The three horseshoes or turn right walk for one mile - The windmill. Both serve good food.

Food

The canteen is open all day and evening for food, both veggie and meat options.

Thursday 8am-11:30pm Friday 8am-11:30pm

Saturday 8am-1:30pm, and 8:30pm- midnight

Sunday 8am-2:30pm

Juggling

The conference room (workshop 1 and 2) becomes the 24 hr juggling hall in the evening, the big top will be open 24 hrs but won't be heated into the early hours. At some point there will be a glow juggling session in the dark, check the notice boards.

Workshops

The workshop board will be at registration or inside the big top (I'm not sure yet!). There are still lots of spaces if you want to run a workshop, just write it on the board in an empty slot. You should have received a workshop list at registration. The trapeze workshops are limited to 12 people per workshop - first come first served, sign up at registration.

Shopping

Please support the traders, you know you need some new toys. They are in the tent near registration and should be open from about 10am till 6pm each day.

Bonfire - Thurs 8.30pm

With Pete Castle. As a storyteller Pete tells a mixture of traditional stories, tall tales, urban myths and extended jokes. Many of them are about or include music/song. A chilled out start to the evening. Story telling will be in beer tent if wet.

We need volunteers of all skill levels to take part; from polished stand alone fire acts, to people who just fancy doing a bit of fire at the back. There will be some big group events that everyone can join in in...innit! With some stunning sculptures and pantstastic pyrotechnics provided by TePooka this will be an event not to be missed. Meet at 5pm in beer tent to volunteer.

The games and public show - Sat afternoon - evening

Free buses will take you to the games on Sat at 1.15pm from near the site entrance. You don't have to go to the games but if you don't catch the free bus at this time you will have to make your own way to the public show. Don't forget your show ticket!

The games start at 2.00pm in Derby Market Place where the buses drop you off, not only are there games but some stage shows, uni-hockey final, uni trials and the first running of the Derby-Derby. The games finish at 5ish giving you a couple of hours to eat and drink before the doors open for the public show at 7.00pm. There are loads of bars and eateries within a few minutes walk.

Buses pick you up and take you back to site at 10.15pm from outside the theatre.

Renegade - Thurs, Fri, Sat at midnight

For those that don't know, it is a forum where we entertain each other - an open mic for jugglers. You don't have to juggle of course, just be entertaining. The more unusual the better.
