## Your safety and security

You have a pass and a show ticket. Your pass is your proof that you have paid: please keep it with you at all times. If you cannot produce a pass, you will be asked to purchase one or to leave the site. You will need your show ticket in order to get into the public show on Saturday night.

Please look out for your own safety and that of your fellow jugglers: in particular, keep an eye on children near the lake. For first aid please see the front desk or the Dome staff. The fire assembly point is in the main car park. Fire juggling should be done in the designated area in front of the big top by the lake, and is done at your own risk. Our insurance mandates only one person in that area at a time :-(. Oh, and please don't pour or shake paraffin near the lake - it will harm the fish.

Please don't leave valuables unattended in your car or tent.

**Smoking** is not allowed inside the building, the marquee or the big top. **Fires** and **dogs** (except guide dogs) are not allowed on site; please also be considerate of our neighbours, and keep campsite **noise** down after 11pm.

For **!ost property**, and **lost children**, see the front desk. If the front desk is closed, security personnel will deal with lost children.

If you remembered to bring a swimming costume, there's a pool: if you didn't remember, there's still the ice rink. Present your pass when you pay to get a discount.


Make sure you look through the schedule opposite, which will give you an idea of what kind of shows and events will be happening through the week. Keep an eye on the noticeboard for late breaking details.


